

### "Escanaba in Da Moonlight" Features All-Star Cast

Thirty-five-year-old Reuben Soady can't catch a break. He is "the oldest Soady in the history of Soadys" to never bag a buck, and he is willing to try anything and everything to get rid of that reputation. As we observe the Soady males in their natural habitat - a hunting cabin in the Upper Peninsula - we first meet our narrator Albert, Reuben's father, played by Tim Bolton of Fremont. Sam Waugaman of Sandusky portrays Reuben's younger brother Remnar, who is "not da sharpest tool in da shed" but a good hunter. And then, of course, there's Reuben himself, played by Ben Archer of Clyde.

Possibly the most outrageous character, Jimmer Negamanee, is portrayed by Michael PJ Foos of Gibsonburg. Quite the odd duck, Jimmer claims to have been abducted by aliens for an entire weekend and came back...different. Rounding out the cast are Steve Koenig of Huron, who appears as Ranger Tom T. Treado from Detroit, and Laura Buchanan of Gibsonburg as Wolf Moon Dance, Reuben's wife.

FCT welcomes Griff Allen to FCT for his directorial debut at FCT. Best known for his work with the Genoa Civic Theatre, Griff says he has been enjoying working with this cast a great deal. Among quite a bit of male bonding and boyish humor, there is a heart to this comedy that will appeal even to the most sensible audience member. *(continued on Page 2)*



# More Than a Stage in Your Life: THE SCOTT AND PJ (OR THE PJ AND SCOTT) SHOW!

*If you haven't been following FCT on Facebook, you may have missed one of the more fun marketing ventures that FCT has recently undertaken. Recently, Scott Havice and Michael PJ Foos took the time to answer some questions about their YouTube Show, which can be found by anyone who has internet access at:*

**Q:** *There seems to be some confusion over the title of your show. Is it "The Scott and PJ Show," or "The PJ and Scott Show"?*

**Scott:** Yes

**PJ:** Most certainly

**Q:** *Why YouTube?*

**Scott:** It's because you told us to make videos for YouTube. It is not in our pay grade to question why. Actually we were hoping to broaden FCT's demographic in a way that is reflective of how many of today's consumers get information.

**PJ:** Really, I just like the word 'tube'!

**Q:** *How long does it take to put one of your shows together?*

**PJ:** Our last video probably took around 7 hours. This included conception, filming, and editing.

**Scott:** It would take a lot longer if we didn't have the expertise and guidance of Floyd Collins. Many of the effects would not be possible without his knowledge of film editing.

**PJ:** We come up with ideas and Floyd helps us make them happen.

**Q:** *How much footage do we actually see compared to what you shoot?*

**PJ:** For just our intro and closure we probably have at least an hour of video for a couple of minutes of final product.

**Scott:** We have to start and stop a lot because PJ doesn't know what he is doing. I however rarely make mistakes.

**PJ:** Yeah right! I think we can disprove that when we come out with our upcoming bloopers reel.

**Q:** *You seem like you are having fun when you make the videos. Is that real, or are you acting?*

**PJ:** He's having fun, I'm acting.

**Scott:** At the very least we want to make sure we are amusing ourselves.

**PJ:** We want to make it fun for everyone. We enjoy riffing off of each other. We like to come up with things that make us giggle but also inform the public about FCT and its offerings.

**Q:** *You filmed the last video from the moon. Are you going to shoot on location for future videos?*

**Scott:** That depends on the budget for each show. We are really pulling for the playreading committee to choose South Pacific for next year's 60th anniversary season as long as they do it in January.

**PJ:** With our luck they will pick Donte's Inferno for the July show.

**Q:** *Do you ever have guests on your show?*

**Scott:** We have done a couple of videos with guests. Clearly you are not one of the seventeen people that actually watch our videos.

**PJ:** We have been surprised by the number of people that have watched the episodes.

**Scott:** Even taking away all of the times my mom watches it.

**Q:** *How can someone be a part of "The Scott and PJ (or is it The PJ and Scott) Show"?*

**PJ:** I'm not going to dignify that question with an answer. It's obviously the PJ and Scott show.

**Scott:** Money talks. Oh, and it's the Scott and PJ show.

**Q:** *You are most well-known as actors on the FCT stage. How has Fremont Community Theatre been "More Than a Stage in Your Life"?*

**PJ:** I've been a part of FCT for the past 34 years. I met my wife here, we got married on stage by a member of the theatre, and our kids call FCT their second home. It's a hobby the whole family enjoys and I can't imagine my life without FCT.

**Scott:** What he said except my wife just enjoys getting me out of the house.

## Elections


